
## WATCHING FOR GOD

Early in July I traveled to Costa Rica, along with Erica Petitti, to visit my son Daren, who was living and working there for the summer. Daren and I had the opportunity to hike through the jungle at Manuel Antonio, a national park located on the Pacific coast. The park was so dense with trees, vines and rainforest plant life that the ocean breeze that was nearby along the coast could not penetrate the jungle, and the air was heavy with humidity and heat. While focused on my own physical discomfort, I was unable to see beyond the greenery to what was lying before me. But two things happened to transform my experience from uncomfortable to spectacular. First, I took a long drink of water to cool my thirst and then slowed my step. Then, I began to gaze into the rainforest, and to peer and peek and stop and stare and look and listen, and the jungle began to come alive. There were lizards as small as my fingernail, quietly waiting to be discovered among the lush tropical foliage. There were sloths hanging lazily in the tops of the trees, visible only when I stopped and took the time to survey the treetops with my binoculars. There were colorful crabs and birds and monkeys and all sorts of exotic wildlife to be seen if one only took the time to be still and to patiently survey God's good earth to discover them. But without patience and close observance, one could easily walk through the rainforest and emerge having seen nothing other than bromeliads and palm trees.

Too often in the rush of our daily lives we are so busy with the tasks required or expected of us, or so distracted, that we fail to stop and to listen and to take out the binoculars of our faith and to look for God, just as I nearly failed to see the wildlife in the Costa Rica rainforest until I slowed my pace and stood patiently and waited and watched and observed.

As we embark upon the busy season of autumn, and begin another church year and school year, let us remember to take the time to look for God in our lives and the lives of others, to use our faith binoculars to peer into the jungle of daily living and to see the beauty that is often hidden from plain view but is spectacular and wonderful and inspiring. Watch for God, and may your sightings be a source of renewal and wonder and awe.

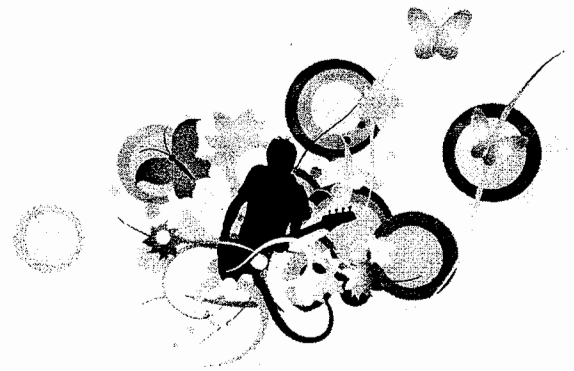
# UNCOMMON WORSHIP

Scripture: Book of Jonah

Bible Verse: I have chosen the way of faithfulness; I set your ordinances before me.

God chooses us to do God's work. God gives us the freedom to choose our response to God and others. We look to God's teachings to help us learn how to make choices that reflect what God wants us to do or be. By the end of the unit, children will understand that: 1) God gives us the freedom to make choices; 2) we can learn how to make informed choices to help us deal with difficult situations that involve standing up to peer pressure, keeping ourselves safe, and keeping our bodies healthy; 3) the choices we make affect ourselves and other people; 4) God provides us with the tools, techniques, and resources we need to make wise and appropriate choices. 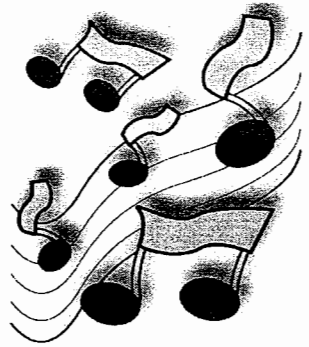

# Music at First Church

We have been treated to a summer of great music, and are looking forward to an exciting upcoming church year: special music for our 8:30 service; a Music Sunday presentation in collaboration with the Methodist and other churches; some exceptional music planned for Advent, Christmas Eve and



Christmas. We'll sing everything from Renaissance to Bach to Gospel and beyond. Other musical events include some performances and demonstrations at First Church's Fall Festival, vocal master classes and workshops for singers throughout the year, and some special concerts and presentations outside of the church service.

The Concert Committee has a terrific season planned, with performances by groups such as the incomparable **Anonymous 4**, an internationally known women's a cappella quartet, in their only CT appearance on October 11; the amazing duo **Lost and Found**, who played for the National Youth Event last year; the Celtic folk group **Wild Asparagus**, featuring fiddle player Becky Tracy, (daughter of late long-time parishioner Dick Tracy) and one, perhaps two, jazz cabarets in Palmer Hall, with great jazz players such as Dan and Joe Campolieta and Doug Maher.

Music at First Church has been a long-standing tradition, and we have a place for all, no matter what your musical taste or ability. Anyone who is interested in being actively involved in shaping First Church's worship experience, and who enjoys the marvelous creativity of making music, is invited to become part of our program. Take a look at our rehearsal schedule, and please feel free to come to any group, even if just to watch, listen and enjoy:

**Occasional Choir:** Thursday evenings at 6:30 in the music room

This is a fun group that sings a bit more than once a month, doing music that is on the lighter side: from jazz to contemporary to classical. (High School age and up).

**Chancel Choir:** Thursday evenings at 7:30 in the music room

This is the largest and longest-lived singing group of our music ministry. They provide choral music for most regular services; special services, and they present at least one major work a year. The group presents music of many different styles, from Medieval and Baroque to early American and Contemporary. (High school age and up)

**Women's Praise Choir:** Wednesday afternoons at 4:00 in the music room

This is a close harmony, three to five part treble choir, which not only sings contemporary compositions, but gospel, contrapuntal and classical music as well. (High School age and up)

**Choral Bells:** Thursday evenings at 6:15 in room 29

This is a delightful handbell choir directed by Jeannie Boehner, presenting not only service music throughout the year, but also participating in an annual area bell festival in the spring.

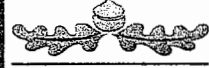
